

Client/Server Setup – Cheat sheet (W2000/XP)

Make sure your PCs have users listed as a Power User OR Administrator

Go to **Start|Settings|Control Panel|Users and Passwords *Users tab*** – make sure *User's name* is there, and *Group* is Power User or Administrator. If not, the administrator of that PC must go into Users and Passwords, properties, and in *group membership tab* to add user as: Other – Administrator or Standard/Other – Power user group.

Note: Load data files on file server (making sure server has sharing capabilities), (not to the C drive)

In Windows Explorer of **SERVER**, right-click on Server Drive, select **Sharing**, set to **Shared as** and click **Full Access**, click **Apply** and **OK**. (*Refer to Setting up Programs on WXP/2000 for more info on sharing & security, if needed.*)

On other client machines/workstations:

In Windows Explorer, Go into **Network Neighborhood OR My Network Places/Computers Near Me** and right-click to select **MAP Network Drive** and make that drive the dedicated server, give it a letter like **J:** (example), (If not listed already).

- * *If message comes up:* Do you want to reconnect at Login – click **YES**
- * In BDE administrator set path to **J:\Program Files\Youth Enrollment\Data** by clicking on the path and the ellipsis to *find* the path (this will properly set the path without keying errors)
(under Databases|WinYouth(orWinFair)|Path)
- * In BDE administrator set Net Dir = **J:**
(Go to Configuration|Drivers|Native|Paradox)

Note: If you have a mixture of machines i.e. a W2000 and W98 you will need to make sure you go into the BDE administrator on all machines and set the **Local Share** under **Configuration|System|INIT**, change to **TRUE**

OR – Set up will be slightly different if sharing at a different level from server drive (client machines listed above).

NOTE: If you want to share only a folder, can do sharing at folder level (instead of server drive), Example: then must set NET DIR J:\Program Files\Fair – directing to Winfair program folder.

Path under Databases tab|Winfair **must be at a minimum of one level lower** as J:\Program Files\Fair\Data (or whatever you named the path)

Note: Make sure that the Data path (under Databases tab) is at a minimum of one level lower than the Net Dir Drive in (Configuration tab).
